- Make polluters pay The UK government should show leadership on establishing new and additional sources of finance for countries suffering loss and damage caused by climate-related disasters. <a href="https://makepolluterspay.co.uk/">https://makepolluterspay.co.uk/</a>
- Stop funding climate breakdown There should be an immediate end to the use of public money to support fossil fuel extraction and power, in the UK and overseas
- Build Back Better The UK and Scottish governments must invest in a green and just recovery from the Covid-19 pandemic, prioritising measures that will promote equality and wellbeing as well as cutting emissions.
- In Scotland support Stop Climate Chaos Scotland's campaign to increase the Climate Justice Fund.
