The Mount School - Clerk of committee's report 2021

Good morning Friends. Last year I brought you this report on the work of the school's governing body via Zoom but I am delighted to be here with some of you today in person.

Quakers in Yorkshire appoints the members of both School Committees, and there have been some changes since last year. Those of you who are regular attenders at QiY may have heard these reported during 2020-21; just to recap: Shoana Mackay, Joan Concannon and I were appointed for a second term starting in January 2021; Era Gjurgjeala, an Old Scholar nominee, stepped down in July for personal reasons; and Greg Willmott has been co-opted onto the committee as my deputy.

Many of you will know that serving on any committee brings all sorts of things – hard work, the joy of fellowship, and the challenge of the unexpected. The pandemic has certainly brought us all of that, and I want to pay tribute to everyone – governors, teaching and support staff alike for their enduring and extraordinary commitment over the last year, under the exceptional leadership of our principal Adrienne Richmond. She will have more to say about the school year in a moment.

It would be an understatement to say this has been a challenging year. I would just like to acknowledge that navigating a path through the labyrinth of government rules and changes of policy has created an extremely demanding environment, and I know all pupils and parents are most grateful for the way in which it has been handled.

This is my fifth report to you as clerk of the MSY cttee, and one of my responsibilities as chair of a board of charity trustees (because that is what we are) is to be aware of the committee's needs. Do we have the right balance of expertise and experience to run the organisation well? Is there someone ready to take over as clerk when the time comes? I am now in my second term on the committee so that time certainly is coming!

The School's Nominations sub-committee, old scholars, the parents association and the nominations committee of Quakers in Yorkshire all have a role to play in finding the right people to join the committee. We are always actively looking for new members. If any of you think you might have something to offer The Mount at this time of change, I would be very glad to hear from you.
