Racial Justice - Question of the Month

Minute 27 of Britain Yearly Meeting 2022 ends with the statement "We have heard that love and justice also require us to consider deeply how the Society of Friends in Britain might make financial and other reparation for our part in the wrongs of the transatlantic slave trade."

The International Center for Transitional Justice says that "Reparations are meant to recognize and redress the wrongdoing that occurred and to repair the consequences of the violations to the extent possible."

CARICOM, a long-standing grouping of 20 Caribbean countries (a sort of Caribbean equivalent of the EU), speaks about <u>Reparatory</u>

<u>Justice</u>, rather than reparations - a term with much broader implications.

Our questions this time are:

Have you ever in your life had a positive experience of

reparatory justice?

What does reparatory justice mean to you?

Quakers in Yorkshire Trustee Annual Report for 2022

2022 was a year of recovering from the Covid pandemic. It started with uncertainty as to whether physical activities would be possible and ended with confidence that lockdowns and restrictions were no longer needed as vaccinations had overcome the worst consequences. Quakers in Yorkshire was able to hold successful live events for Easter Settlement, Junior Holidays and Holiday School.

The quarterly meetings in 2022 tried to strike the right balance between sensitivity to Covid precautions and enabling Friends to meet together. There was a mix of formats during the year.

Committees worked hard to fulfil their remits, mostly by meeting online. Thanks go to the members of Nominations Committee, Arrangements Committee, Outreach Projects Committee and the Under 19s Coordinating Group. Also to the organising groups for Easter Settlement, Junior Holidays and Holiday School.

Both income and expenditure were significantly higher than 2021. The total income was £52,780, compared to £24,893 last year, as events returned to normality. The increase in total expenditure was £65,831 compared to £51,611 last year but 2021 was inflated due to the giving of funds to Britain Yearly Meeting to fund the Yorkshire Youth Development Worker.


