### Costs & Bursaries

When event has some small cost associated with it, eg. Pizza, our default is “free – donations welcomed”. Funding for my role comes from Yorkshire Quakers, so if you are a Yorkshire Quaker with a direct debit I wouldn’t worry at all, if not, consider contributing, but know that is totally optional. Some events have more significant costs associated with them, residential or high ticket activities like climbing or trampolining. These say “chargeable”, however bursaries are available *in every case*.
